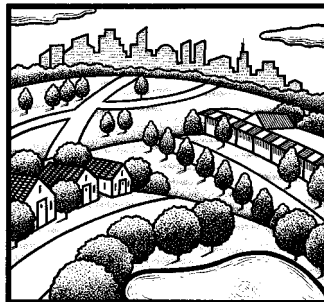
Trees reduce home energy costs, improve property values and lower the cost of controlling storm water.
